ABRASIVES

PLASTIC BLADES

POWER WASHING

Do not directly spray electrical components, plastics, motors, or Teflon rings.

SUBMERGING

Only submerge full metal parts, i.e blades. Do not submerge parts for more then 1 hour.

HOW TO

Begin by powering down your equipment. For conveyors it is OK to leave them on for easier cleaning.

STEP 1 PREP

Read though this guide and prepare your cleaning area with gloves and tools.

STEP 3 ABRADE Using an approved abrasive, clean the affected area.

STEP 2 SOAK

STEP 4 subs Using soapy water and a lint free cloth, wipe away remaining debris and solutions.

Soak the affected area with an approved solution using the chart below.

IMPORTANT!

Never use cleaners with ammonia, trisodium phosphate, or chemicals harmful to aluminum, stainless steel, polyurethane, or HDPE.

BLADES

When applying force, ensure the blade is laying completely flat on a flat surface.

Do not power wash or attempt to clean off the Teflon ring unless you are replacing it.

BELTS & BANDS

Do not use isopropyl alcohol on sorter bands.

It is safe to run the equipment on low speeds to fully clean the belts or bands.

Do not remove grease from belt or band drive axles.
